THIS WEEK'S LESSON: SELFISH SLIME



IN THE CAR:

Ask your child what they learned about this week on the drive home:

In Jacob and Esau's culture, the "birthright" was a very important privilege, but Esau treated it like it was nothing – which would lead to big troubles down the road. When we are selfish, and think only about ourselves, it can lead to a slimy situation. Genesis 25:21-34, Esau Sells His Birthright

What you need to know:
