THIS WEEK'S LESSON: DRIVE-THRU



IN THE CAR:

Ask your child what they learned about this week on the drive home:

There's usually nothing very extraordinary about your average drive-thru meal; you're usually just there to get a simple meal and get back on the road. The Israelites journey out of slavery began with a very simple, but special meal to show us that God has special things in store for us. Exodus 12:1-14, 31-42, Passover



HANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real:

Take the kids out for a take out or drive thru meal. Share with them a memorable meal you had with your parents and why it meant something to you. Ask your kids how simple things like the Passover meal can remind us of God's plans.



AT DINNER:

Here are some great discussion starters:

- What is the Passover meal?
- How did the Passover remind God's people of how he saved them?
- How do we know that God has great things in store for us?



AT BEDTIME:

Quiz your child on this week's memory verse:

"But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well." Matthew 6:33 (NIV)



PARENT TIME:

What you need to know:

The Passover not only foreshadowed the future of Israel and their escape to the Promised Land, it pointed to the coming of Jesus and our Salvation. God has great things in store for us if we place our trust in him. Remind your kids of this promise, and pray with them that God will lead all of you just as he did Moses and the Israelites.
